EDITORIAL DESK

The first quarter of financial year 2021-22 saw India take its fight against COVID-19 to the next level with the announcement of free vaccines for all above 18 years of age from June 21. The quarter also witnessed the hardships of lockdown and the insurmountable stress people underwent with the sudden spurt of 2nd Wave.

With focus on vaccination and its availability, 75 per cent will be procured by the Centre and the remaining 25 per cent will continue to be available for private hospitals.

To take the momentum head on, on June 21, approximately 8,270,000 doses were administered across the country—India's largest single-day total to date. Madhya Pradesh and Karnataka had the highest local totals.

India surpassed over 300 million vaccine doses administered in total on June 23. India overtook the United States in total vaccine doses administered on June 28.

Meanwhile, Ahmedabad-based pharmaceutical firm has requested emergency use approval for its ZyCoV-D

three-dose Covid shot that is the world's first Plasmid DNA vaccine. It also says the vaccine is safe for children between 12 and 18 years and is in the second phase of trials.

The quarter also saw the Centre propose amendments to the Consumer Protection (E-Commerce) Rules, 2020 and seek public comments on banning fraudulent flash sales and mis-selling of goods and services on e-commerce platforms, and also on making registration of these entities mandatory with DPIIT.

Ban on misleading users by manipulating search results, and appointment of chief compliance officer and resident grievance officer are some of the other amendments that have been proposed.

In economy-related news, India's retail inflation raced to 6.3% in May, breaching the upper limit of the central bank's inflation target for the first time in six months, and bringing further pressure on an economy whipped by the second wave of COVID-19 infections.

Wholesale price inflation also galloped to a fresh 11-year-high of 12.94% in May,

having breached double digits in April on the back of rising global commodity prices.

In a boost to COVID-hit sectors, Finance minister Nirmala Sitharaman few days back announced a fresh set of measures for the tourism sector and small businesses, apart from steps to boost health infrastructure, both in the private and public sector.

The Chamber will soon see the passing of the baton from Mr. T R Parasuraman to Mr. K R Sekar in the coming days. The preparations for the Annual General Meeting has set in and hopefully the announcement of the date will be made soon. The Chamber crossed a significant milestone of hosting more than 150 events in this Presidential year, being aired free to all our esteemed members.

Mr. R Srinivasan President, BCIC, 1987-88

As the Executive Director of Widia (India) Limited I got involved with the Greater Mysore Chamber of Commerce in the late seventies, soon after it was formed by the founder President, the great Mr. M.A. Srinivasan. For those of you who don't know, Mr. M. A. Srinivasan was a Minister in the Princely State of Mysore and also a Dewan of Gwalior and he thought it was necessary to have an exclusive body to represent the interests of Industries-This was the genesis of the Chamber.

I also had the great fortune to interact and work with other stalwarts in industry and Business of that time like Maj. Gen. D.C. Mishra, Mr. A. S. Lakshmanan, Mr. Subba Rao and others.

In the early days of the Chamber many meetings were held in the office of Mr. Lakshmanan as it was situated centrally and the warmth and camaraderie I experienced helped me, an inexperienced executive, to get easily associated with the diverse activities, many of them dealing with Industrial and economic policies of the state. It took many years and whole hearted support of the members to raise funds to buy its own office space.

I distinctly recall the sudden total disruption, when a 100% power cut was imposed on the Industry without any notice! Mr. Lakshmanan with a wealth of knowledge and expertise in the power domain, spearheaded the various discussions with the government. The Chamber played a very useful role in shaping the approach to deal with the power shortage in the state which has been plaguing the industry for many years since then.

I can never forget the innovative solution the Chamber came up with under Mr. Lakshmanan's leadership to deal with the perennial power problem for which there was no easy solution. I am proud

even today, to have been part of the Committee which boldly proposed to the Government of Karnataka to impose an additional surcharge on power consumed to create a Fund to finance the 120 MW Power Station in Yelahanka- a pioneering project on the lines of a Public Private Partnership. Imagine making the meager power given to Industry even costlier! It was Mr. Lakshmanan's conviction, clarity and communication which got the Industry to rally behind this initiative. Unfortunately there were quite a few procedural delays and eventually when the power plant came up it provided great relief to industries in Bangalore.

I was elevated to the position of the President in 1987-88 and had the opportunity to serve the Industry. I received full support from all the Past Presidents and senior members to discharge my duties. The secretariat led by Mr. Viswanathan did very good work to liaison with the Government, and progressively spread the activities to cover a whole range of issues. Serving the membership and holding programmes to suit their needs, the Membership of this body has grown and today BCIC stands tall and is recognized as a powerful voice of the Industry in the state.

Session on Exploring opportunities for Indian Start-ups/ SMEs in the State of Pennsylvania on March 9, 2021

Mr. TR Parasuraman, President, BCIC, in his welcome address highlighted the strategic, defence and economic partnership between India and the US before specifically talking about the presence of Indian companies in various sectors in the State of Pennsylvania.

Dr. Krishnashree Achuthan, Dean, PG Programs, Amrita TBI said that Indian start-up ecosystem is the second largest in the world with over 20,000 start-ups and Y-O-Y growth of 10-12%. She said 1,400 new start-ups commence operations in India on a yearly basis. Factors that make India attractive for start-ups include ease of doing business,

proximity to customers and vendors and the size of the domestic market. India also has a large number of graduates working either in start-ups or corporate institutions and this is growing on a yearly basis. India is also the second largest consumer Internet market globally with 462 million users. There are close to 120 start-up incubators in India. Various initiatives have been taken by India's Central government over last 5 years to help and encourage start-ups, she said.

Mr. David Briel, Deputy Secretary for International Business Development, Department of Community and Economic Development, Commonwealth of

Pennsylvania and Mr. Aron Starosta, Vice President - Commercialization and New Ventures. Science Center in their presentation highlighted Pennsylvania's economic status, Import and Export; key sectors viz., Agribusiness; Manufacturing; Life Sciences and Technology Startups in particular. Pennsylvania is ready to offer 'Concierge Services" to companies looking to invest in the State. These "Services" will include making introductions, helping with connections, and customized financial assistance. Pennsylvania also has a wide international network that can help companies expand their global reach, they said.



Sharing of experience - Operation Black Tornado (26/11 Mumbai attacks) by Brig. Sunil Sheoran on March 10, 2021

It is vital and crucial for corporates to take care of and secure their data and digital content as well as help the government in securing electricity infrastructure because data terrorism and other forms of "invisible" terrorism are a genuine threat, according to Brig. Sunil Sheoran, SM Commandant, Parachute Regiment Training Centre, Bangalore. He also emphasized that good training plays an important role in the corporate world too.

Brig. Sheoran addressed a webinar as part of Bangalore Chamber of Industry and Commerce's Leadership Forum and also shared his experience of National Security Guards' (NSG) Operation Black Tornado during the 26/11 attacks.

Talking about the 26/11 attacks, Brig. Sheoran said the terrorists came to create mayhem and kill people. Taking hostages was not their intention initially, he said, and added that the unprecedented scale of the attack exposed the lack of adequate security machinery in the country. Brig. Sheoran pointed out that while the

security machinery in the country has improved since 26/11, they will have to be ready to deal with cyber-attacks among other modern forms of terror attacks.

Brig. Sheoran, who was Col. Sheoran at the time of the 26/11 attacks, led the elite team of NSG 51 SAG commandos, in a 60hour battle against the terrorists. Under

his leadership, the team took back the landmark locations of Taj Mahal Palace Hotel, Oberoi-Trident Hotel and Nariman House that were under attack and rescued hundreds of hostages. However, the team lost two of their own men, including Major Sandeep Unnikrishnan, who was martyred in action at Taj Mahal Palace Hotel.

Drawing alignments between the armed forces and the corporate world, Brig. Sheoran said it is important for individuals across the society to be self-

disciplined, and added that it is important for commerce, industry, government as well as diplomacy to be a well-oiled machine and work together for the country's overall progress. He also praised today's youth and said they are quite aware of the value system as well as the latest developments around them

Earlier in his welcome address, TR Parasuraman, President, BCIC, said that he had heard Brig. Sheoran recently speak at another seminar and was moved by his speech. Mr. Parasuraman said he decided at that time to invite Brig. Sheoran to address BCIC members, and added that he is glad the decorated army officer accepted the invitation. Mr. Parasuraman said India would never forget the 26/11 attacks, and added BCIC pays homage to the innocent civilians who lost their lives as well as to the brave security officers who were martyred in the line of duty during the attacks.



Webinar on SC Ruling on Software Royalty on March 12, 2021

The Government in 2012 took the controversial step of amending the law retrospectively thus trying to set at naught various rulings in favour of the taxpayer that has been one of the most hotly debated tax issues in India. In the last several years, there have been a series of decisions on the issue, both in favour of and against taxpayers, by various Tribunals and High Courts.

Taxability of software in India has been one of the most heavily debated and controversial matters other than transfer pricing. While many Tribunals, Courts and AAR rulings had come in favour of the assessee, the Karnataka

High Court alone had a different view setting aside precedents followed in other states and even international jurisprudence and OECD commentaries on the matter.

The controversy that lasted for more than 2 decades was put to rest comprehensively by the Hon'ble Supreme Court on March 2, 2021. In its 226-page judgment, the Supreme Court elaborately discussed all facets of the issue and ruled comprehensively in favour of the taxpayer.

Given this background, the BCIC under the aegis of Direct Taxes Expert Committee organized the Webinar on analyzing the Supreme Court decision in detail, and discuss the impact of this judgement on various other aspects.

The session was addressed by Mr. N Venkataraman, Additional Solicitor General of India and Mr. S Ganesh, Senior Advocate, Supreme Court of India, the eminent and leading Senior Advocate from Supreme Court of India deliberating on the recent landmarks decisions of the apex court.

AGNII is executed at Invest India, India's National Investment Promotion Agency. AGNII seeks to capture science, technology and

innovation value through: (a) economic value – revenue and equity from science and technology base; (b) social value – upgrading institutional capacity for human development capabilities.

Awareness session on various schemes of the Government for MSMEs on March 19, 2021

Dr. Balamurugan A, Member, MSME Council, BCIC and Director, Growth Hacking Partners,made an exhaustive presentation on the ways of approach of various schemes of the Government initiated to motivate MSMEs in their business in improving their competitiveness.

Dr. Balamurugan, a QCI certified ZED consultant working closely with MSME – DI in his presentation covered on the following initiatives:

- Make in India initiatives;
- ZED assessment and rating (Zero "Bad" effect and Zero Defect auditing).

After ZED assessment, manufacturing MSMES can: reduce waste; increase productivity; be more efficient; develop new IPR; expand market;

 Credit linked capital subsidy for Technological upgradation scheme (CLCS-TUS): 15% upfront subsidy for



every technological upgradation/stateof-art upgradation of up to Rs. 1 crore investment; subsidy not applicable if used machinery or for machines of same technology.

- ISO 9000/14000 Certification cost reimbursement: To the extent of 75% of expenditure, subject to a maximum of Rs. 75,000 in each case.
- Lean manufacturing competitiveness for MSMEs formation of mini cluster with ideally 10 MSMEs (minimum 6 units); individual units can go it alone too; 80% subsidy from Govt and 20% to be paid by either Cluster or by individual organization.
- Design clinic for design expertise with MSME - Scheme is for increasing competitiveness of MSMEs through adoption of new design and better products.
- Technology and quality upgradation support to MSMEs (EET energy sufficient technology): Funding support of up to 75% for awareness programmes; subject to maximum of Rs. 75,000 per programme; Implementation of energy efficient technologies in MSME units, 75% of actual expenditure for cluster level energy audit.
- Building awareness in IPR.
- Supporting innovators through incubators: 75% to 85% of project cost (Idea), Rs 15 lakh per Idea; Financial assistance up to Rs 66.5 lakh to Business Incubator for purchasing plant and machinery to strengthen R&D capabilities; financial assistance up to Rs. 1 crore as SEED Capital Support for deserving ideas for startups (@Rs. 20 lakh per start up).
- Micro Small Enterprises Cluster

Development Program (MSE-CDP).

Once the disputants arrive at a mutual settlement, it is final, binding, not appealable and enforceable as a decree.

Interactive Session with Shri. Nitin Gadkari, Hon'ble Minister for MSME, Road Transport and Highways, Government of India on April 27, 2021



At an exclusive interaction with BCIC, Mr. Nitin Gadkari, Honourable Minister for Road Transport & Highways, MSME, Govt of India said the proposed Bengaluru Ring Road project will boost economic activities around the city.

Here are the highlights of his address:

- The detailed project report for the Rs 17,000-crore project is being prepared, and the Karnataka government has assured the Centre it will share 25 per cent of the land acquisition cost and also give GST exemption for steel, cement and other materials used in the project, the Hon'ble Minister said.
- Development of Bengaluru's Outer Peripheral Ring Road would be done by having industrial clusters smart villages and a smart city around it.
- Mr. Gadkari asked industries to collaborate with the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) to develop industrial clusters, which are important for development. He added that industrial clusters can be developed along green express highways too.
- Emphasizing Bengaluru's contribution to the country's economic growth, the

Union minister said the cityis the knowledge capital of India and many companies, including IT companies, are doing excellent work and establishing their units across the world. With all the talented manpower and potential, industry representatives from Bengaluru have to contribute to Atmanirbar Bharat. The government has taken up a number of projects, including 22 green expressway projects, to develop Indian infrastructure to international standards.

- The minister said work on the new express highway between Bengaluru and Chennai has already started, and the Bengaluru-Mysuru road project is going on. It is important for industrial and tourism development in Mysuru region, he said. Work is on at full speed and will be completed by September 2022. He also emphasized the huge potential for amphibious seaplanes and waterways in the country.
- Issues related to ShiradiGhat tunnel project (Mangaluru-Bengaluru) need to be sorted out.

Mr. TR Parasuraman, President, BCIC in his address briefed the Hon'ble Minister

on the activities of the Chamber, theme for the year and the constitution of expert committees and its objectives.

On the Infrastructure development and Highways, Mr. Parasuraman highlighted on the following w.r.t Bengaluru – Mysore Expressway

- 1. The six-laned Bengaluru-Mysuru Expressway has bypasses to all major towns with simple entry-exit provisions, which are away from the designated vehicular underpasses. This may confuse the road users to reach entry/exit points from the main carriageway. The access points have to be made more user friendly.
- 2. Besides, there is a possibility of vehicles coming back in reverse direction to approach exit/entry points after missing it initially and this can result in accidents,. If by chance, a person misses exit/entry point, he has to travel extra distance of more than 10 Kms to reach a point.
- **3.** Technology or digital method should be adopted to pay toll fees to decongest urban town plaza.
- 4. The Open toll facility will not avoid



bullock carts, tractors, three wheelers, two wheelers at the proposed entry-exit locations. Allowing the bullock carts, tractors, three wheelers, two wheelers in the Expressway can cause traffic and safety related issues.

Mr. B Indushekar, Chairman, MSME Council, BCIC presented on the suggestions pertaining to MSME Sector to enhance efficiency:

- Finance: Need for more Development Financial Institutions.
- Quality: Quality as a main enabler for selection of supplier instead of L1.
- Testing: Creating world-class test facilities to enhance speed of development.
- Market: Cluster model to enhance market opportunity.

Mr. Devesh Agarwal, Immediate Past President, BCIC addressed on the national highways on the following:

- a.Improvement in highways overall from Kanyakumari to Kashmir
- **b.**Road network to promote Cultural Tourism
- c.Introduce Bengaluru-Mumbai Expressway and leverage and intensify the existing industrial investment.
- d.Entry/Exit access to industrial areas from highways to be made user friendly.
- e.Scientific approach to policies on NH operations. Example: Currently there are 6 different speed limits even where highway is only 2 lanes. Have only 2 limits.
- f. Use latest toll-tag technology to reduce congestion at urban and semiurban toll booths. (XpressTAG)
- g.Promote a multimodal distribution hub for South Indiain the Dobbespet – Doddaballapurarea.

- h.Highway construction has tripled to almost 40km per day; Similar focus should be given to upgradation and repair of existing highways.
- i. NH63 (Bellary), NH48 (around Satara, Hubli to Chitradurga, Tumkur to Nelamangala), NH75 (Hassan to Sakaleshpur).
- ii. Request the construction of the Shiradi Tunnel Road Project between Mangaluru-Bengaluru be accelerated.

Mr. Kamal Bali, CEO & Managing Director, Volvo, sought support from the minister to have uniform policies on tax concessions across the states in India, while implementing the Motor Vehicles Scrap page Policy.

The BCIC had organized an interactive session with Mr. Jagadish Shettar, Honourable Minister of Large and Medium Scale Industries, Govt of Karnataka, who addressed on the initiatives undertaken by the State Government to support the industries and message to the industries on handling the pandemic by balancing life and livelihood.

Mr. T R Parasuraman, President, BCIC made a presentation comprising:

- Opening of manufacturing units/export units in Karnataka to ensure continuance of supplies as part of national and global supply chain with strict COVID protocols.
- 2. To use the existing buses of BMTC for staff commutation of industry personnel.

- 3. Accelerate the vaccination programme for working class in the factories for achieving industrial stability. Use the support of local industrial associations for vaccinations in industrial areas.
- 4. Provide relief measures as done in COVID-19 1st wave such as waiver of electricity demand charges, rental reliefs on properties, PF contribution on workers, moratorium on loans/OD facility etc.,
- 5. To resolve the consent fees price hike for industries under KSPCB norms.
- 6. To review the recent hike in property taxes in Panchayats for industries and to implement the same post pandemic.
- 7. Encourage quick implementation of oxygen plants by private and public hospitals.

The BCIC had invited Office Bearers/Senior Representatives of various industry associations/ body to participate in the interactive session. They also sought support from the Government on the following, viz., Requests of vaccination of all employees, using stadiums, colleges, marriage halls as Covid Care Centres, easing of employee transport by providing BMTC buses, permission for export units to operate with a defined strength, extension of due dates by 3 months for regulatory compliances by business units, permission for e-com companies to supply essential and non-essential items, relief measures to MSMEs etc.,

He acknowledged voices of various industry captains and industry body representatives and assured that the Government wouldlook into the suggestions. Here is the summary of the Minister's address:

When we look at the other developed economies, they project the positive image of their countries always.

Mr. K R Sekar, Sr. Vice President, BCIC thanked the Hon'ble Minister and the attendees for their valuable time and said that Industry is conscious of its responsibility and will work with Government both at the Central and the State level to combat this crisis.

The Office of Mr. P Ravi Kumar, IAS, Chief Secretary to Government of Karnataka had reached out to the Chamber seeking support by way of joining with BBMP for setting up a new LPG Crematorium near Tavarekere, Magadi Road.

Post the discussions on the subject at the Steering Committee and obtaining consents, the Chamber has proposed its support by way of acting as the Nodal Centre towards facilitating the following:

• BCIC will support setting up of 3 or 4 small LPG Crematorium units - Fully

Automatic LPG Burners with complete gas pipeline system and will have the flexibility to use it. Cost per unit will be Rs. 10 Lakhs plus GST

 BCIC has also come forward to sponsor three freezer compartments which have a capacity of 4 bodies per freezer for storing bodies at the cremation centre. Cost per unit will be Rs. 2.7 Lakhs plus GST.



BCIC Interactive Session with Shri. Nitin Gadkari, Hon'ble Minister for MSME, Road Transport and Highways, Gol on April 27, 2021

KEY TAKEAWAYS

- The project cost of Bangalore Ring Road is Rs. 17,000 Crore including land acquisition cost. Currently, DPR is in progress. There is good potential for road side development on these Ring Roads by creating Industrial Clusters in collaboration with NHAI and Govt. of Karnataka. Smart cities, smart villages can be developed on the sides of ring road alongwith Industrial Clusters, which can manufacture electronics, pharmaceuticals, automotive and medical devices.
- Industrial Associations have to come forward to make JVs with govt. owned industrial training institutes. Govt. has 18 numbers of such institutes. Testing facilities can be set up by these JVs. Focus can be given on training, skill development of youth and bringing in new products. This can be managed by private institutions like Associations/Chambers, which is economically viable. Govt. will act as a facilitator.
- Establish small NBFCs with foreign investment to support member industries with competitive low interest rates. These NBFCs can support MSMEs on financing.
- Companies like Volvo can participate on new technologies, wherein proposals can be considered. There is an opportunity for e-bus and e-truck to ply on the Delhi-Jaipur highway on the Delhi-Mumbai corridor, which highway will be completed in 6 months.
- The Shiradi Ghat Tunnel project is stuck with the Forest & Environment Dept. for the past 5 to 6 years. The Ministry is pursuing the problem with the Karnataka State Govt. Because of this tunnel not getting developed, it is difficult to handle containers from Mangalore Port and for coastal area development. This is also a good alternate connect to Bangalore. Requested BCIC to take it up with the State Govt.
- Central Govt. is developing sea transport and water ways in Karnataka State to bring down the logistics cost. Industry has to come forward to take advantage of this opportunity.
- Bangalore is the Aviation hub in India. The Aviation industry can make a good start in the amphibious sea plane opportunity to promote tourism.
